Definition: Bullous impetigo is a bacterial skin infection caused by Staphylococcus aureus that results in the formation of large blisters called bullae, usually in areas with skin folds like the armpit, groin, between the fingers or toes, beneath the breast, and between the buttocks

Case description: A case of bullous impetigo

A young girl age 4 years.

She had eruptions all over the body.

It started with papules, a week ago it started to increase day by day.

They visited a conventional doctor and he advised to apply steroids.

The eruptions are with discharges, sticky thick, stringy, pustular. With a burning pain.

The child sleeps all the time.
She has constipated stool which must be removed mechanically.
The pain comes and goes suddenly.

It is an introverted closed child, won't speak to strangers, is timid.
She is talking to herself during playing.

- Patient aged 4 years
- Presented with eruptions all over the body
- Pustule, discharging
- Started a week back, as small papular eruptions
- Increased day by day, allopath advised for steroid

- Eruptions joined, big with discharges, sticky, pustules
- Burning
- Child sleeps all the time
- Constipation, stool must be removed mechanically
- Pain comes and goes suddenly
- Introverted, closed child, won't speak to strangers
- Timid
- Talking to herself, mostly during play time

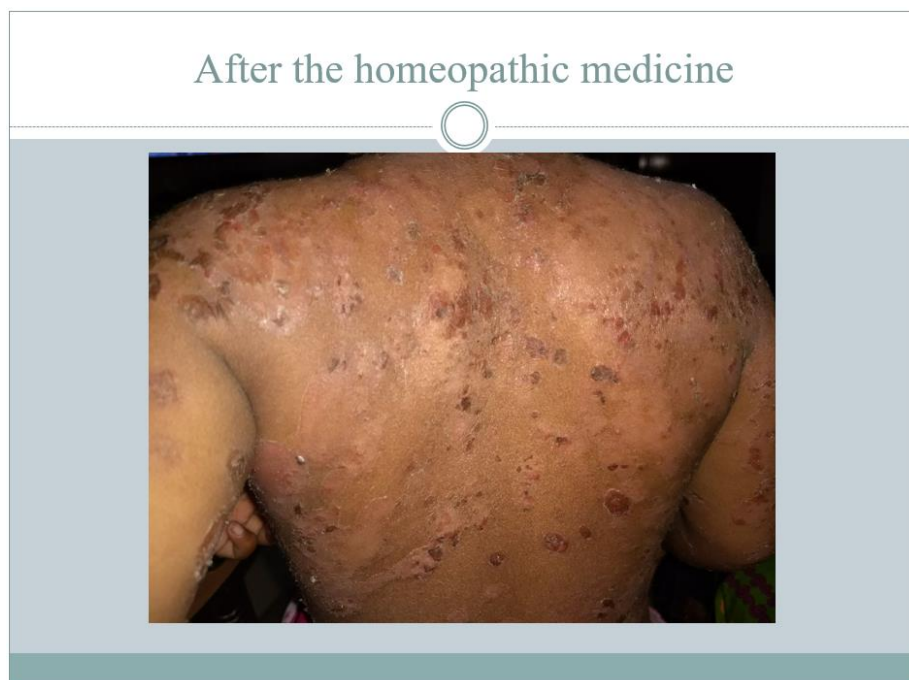




The homeopathic prescription

Case analysis and solution

After selecting the remedy, the case got cured in 10 days, with only a little skin discoloration left where the skin eruptions had been.

There are many possible rubrics to select, also of all the local parts of the body, but below the **actual symptoms** Veneeth used.

Knowing well the materia medica of the remedy Kali-bi and having experience with similar kind of skin eruption cases, Veneeth was quickly able to decide the prescription.

The child received only one dose of **Kali-bi 200C**.

Dr Veneeth mentioned that with hindsight he could have used a few other rubrics.

You will notice that Veneeth in this analysis had not even taken **sticky discharge** rubrics in the analysis.
